

WEST GIPPSLAND

Just a stone's throw from Melbourne, everywhere in West Gippsland is closer than you think. West Gippsland announces itself with rolling green hills, dairy country and a peppering of charming villages just begging for a visit.

With abundant natural playgrounds, wilderness attractions, historic townships and lots of paddock to plate goodness, West Gippsland has all the bases covered for a road trip not far from the city lights.

NOOJEE

Noojee is your first stop on your West Gippy weekend. The town oozes charm and is the perfect base for a weekend visiting the famous Trestle Bridge and the stunningly beautiful Toorong Falls. Grab a coffee at a café, soak up some history at the Noojee Heritage Railway Station Precinct and spin a lure in the Toorong River. If the trout aren't biting, you've got a couple of great pub-grub options in Noojee as well.

YARRAGON

Nestled in the foothills of the Strzelecki Ranges, the rich scenic surrounds are a fitting backdrop for Yarragon Village. The village is a quick detour off the M1, and a leg-stretch stop for lovers of art. With warm inviting cafes, eclectic shops and foodie havens, you can be sure to while away a few hours here. When you're done with all the village charms, take the spectacular drive up to Mt Wonth State Park for some tree fern, rainforest and mountain ash adventures, or head to the Trafalgar Holden Museum for a nostalgic pit stop packed with Aussie motoring history.

WALHALLA AND MOUNTAIN RIVERS

Easily one of Victoria's most photogenic villages, the township of Walhalla is famous for its 19th Century gold mining history, with daily tours of the last remaining mine available. Take a train ride through the "Valley of the Gods" on the Walhalla Goldfields Railway and a self-guided walk through the town, amongst the many lovingly restored and preserved buildings. Surrounded by forest and national park, the township is a stepping off point for 4x4, camping and fishing enthusiasts.

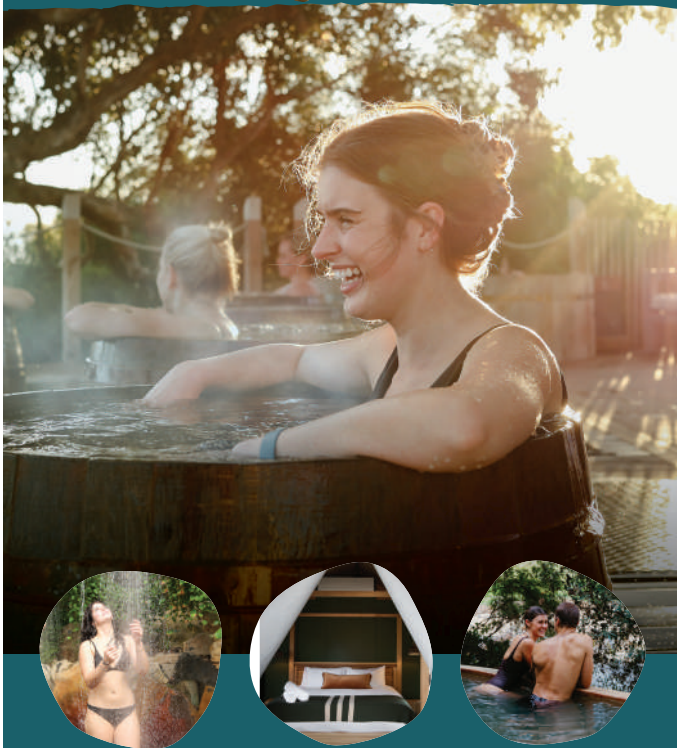

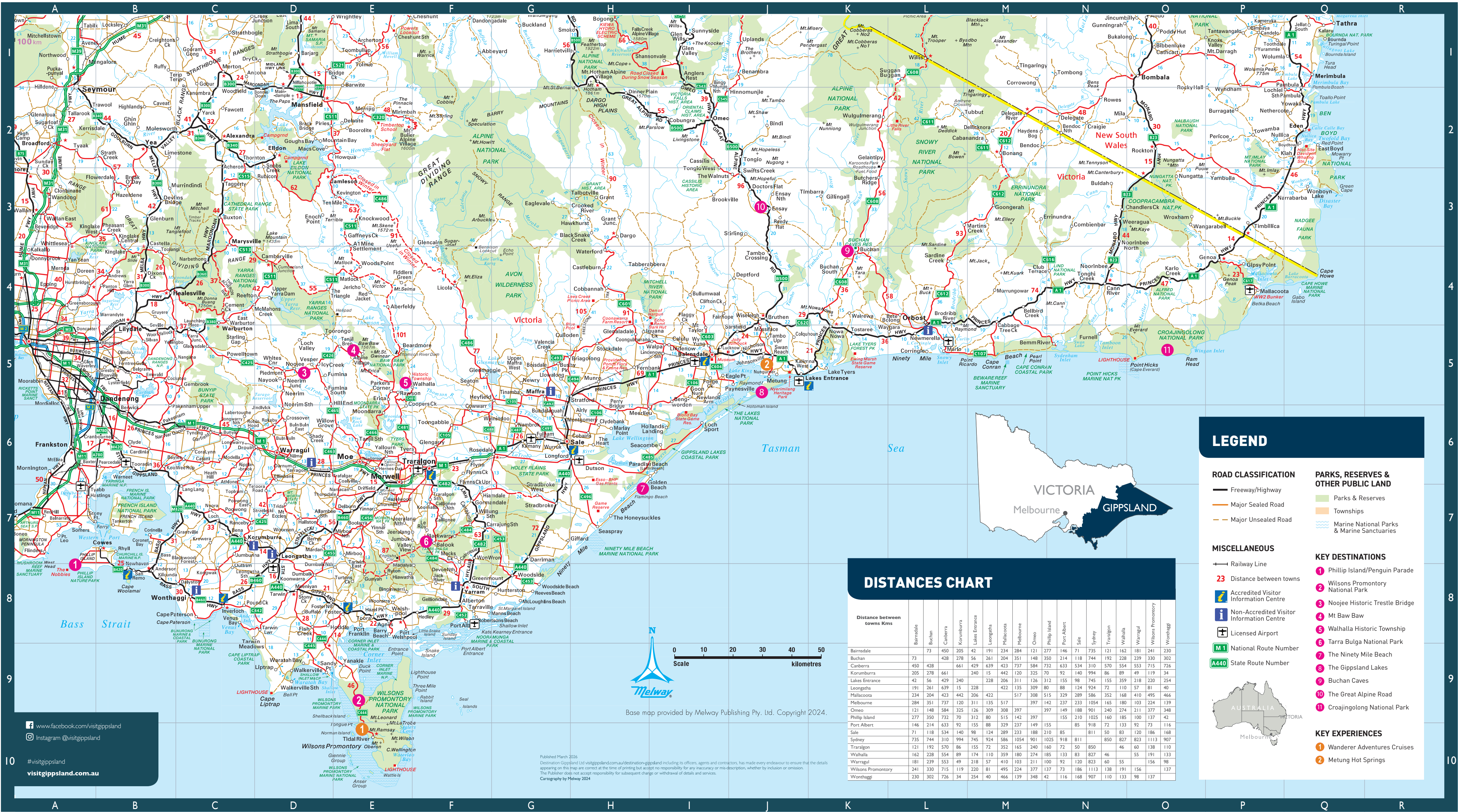

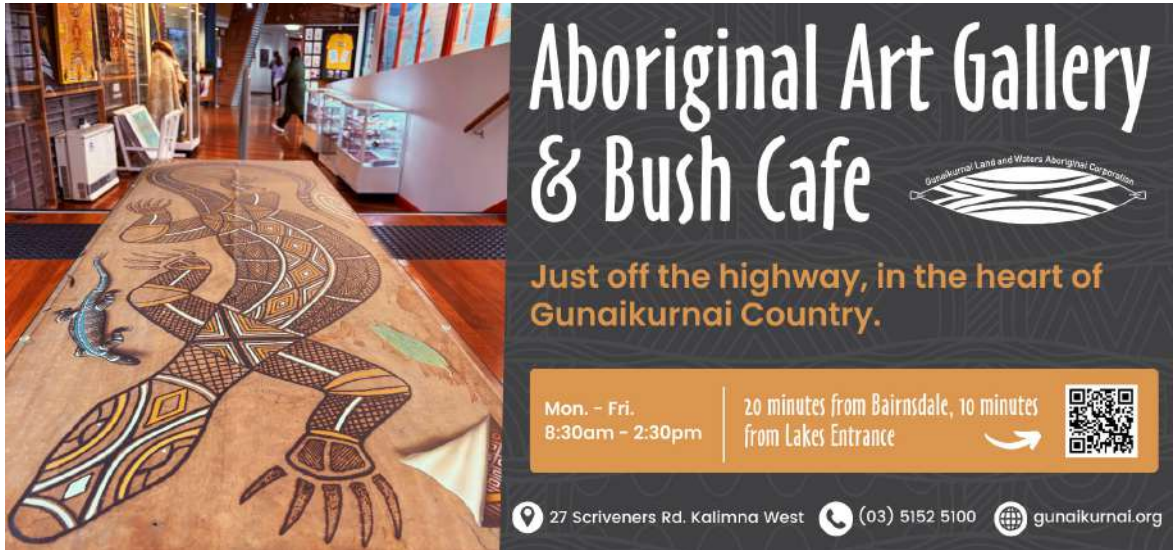
